#### Choreospondance: Dance One

The performers would be wearing their Sunday Best.

Dancers exchange moves with people in the bar by mimicking  
An arm from underneath the table or behind the bar  
Move like Strictly Come Dancing contestants  
The dancers carry each other from table to table (without spilling drinks)

Forks, Spoons & Knives (Percussion)

Dancers banging their tables, standing up quickly, turning, sitting down fast,  
erratic movements  
People in a hurry, changing places, looking rushed, gestures to audience

The dancers move together in unison, a contrast from what they were  
doing, slow reaches, shared lifts, 'community'

A meeting, They have known each other forever, like one person,  
interdependent and fluid!  
It feels right - The dancers find a special moment.

Lobster Costumes  
The Cookie Crumbles  
The lobsters try to perform surgery with their claws but fail due to a lack of  
dexterity

Balloons, Rustling of sweet wrappers, The audience receive sweets  
Performers try to pop each others balloon costumes.
